



Also this year <u>stinkbugs</u> (**b**rown **m**armorated **s**tink **b**ug) start their journeys from these <u>risk countries</u> to New Zealand, threatening to destroy the agriculture – but not with us! We hereby inform you, how your shipment will arrive at your customer – "bugfree" – and whatelse you need to know:

When?

Shipped on Board Date on Bill of Lading from 01.09.23 until date of arrival 30.04.24.

What?

All shipments containing <u>machinery</u>, <u>vehicles or parts</u> must be treated against BMSB before arrival at New Zealand.

Exception: You can provide a manufacturer declaration (only valid for LCL & FCL)! **Attention:** All goods with Italian origin generally always must be treated!

Our Auckland LCL consols are **not** being treated. If your LCL cargo requires treatment, we offer alternative options. Ro/Ro, Breakbulk, Flatracks and Optentop containers always must be treated at port of loading – no matter which goods are transported.

How?

Generally the complete container is being fumigated with <u>SulfuryIdifluorid</u> for at least 12 hours. The outside temperature must be minimum +10°C during the whole treatment time. Heat treatment at around +60°C is also possible.


What to do?

- Clarify with your consignee timely before booking:
 Who will pay for the treatment.
- Plan enough time for the treatment & order it in time.
- Make sure your cargo is <u>ready for treatment</u> before pick up of the goods. The transport packaging must be permeable for the gas – cargo that is wrapped in foil cannot be fumigated unless the foil is sliced on all sides! Make sure that inside the container the gas enough space to circulate.
